6. Critiques / Rehearsal No. 1

#1: Michael Hilton: excerpt from the upcoming novel "Swan Drive" to be published in 2024 small town New Jersey neighborhood: geese move; 10-year-old boy Cal --> has been changed by it; third act (leading to end of the story): Cal and Adam are looking for an adventure; God's Love; at the gulley; "I'll never be 10 again"; "the craters of akne"; "fucking bitch"; "send that fucker off"; "your mother's a whore"; "your father was a junky and the world is a better place now **that he's dead**"; "her nose exploded in blood"; "if you're in here, come out", "there was a grayness to it all"

Feedback:

Andrea: unclear how much time for introduction (1 minute); too long for the reading: action is best

Cindy: very good at building tension

Jim: good at sucking people in

#2: Jadi: "Motley's Crew"

A text consisting for e-mail messages between a college kid and their two parents who are writing about a new neighbor and what the neighbor claims the kid is doing wrong. Getting from role playing to making bombs. "you're involved with bad seeds"; News Flash; misidentified as the criminals.

Feedback:

Barbara: Loves the piece; matches the theme for the reading perfectly

Harish: The voices where clear and distinct

Cindy: some aspects don't seem authentic: people in this age group don't write to their parents in this style --> make the college kid snippier

Harish: It's clear that the dad doesn't trust his son because the father is a conspiracy theorist

Barbara: In her experience people in their mid-twenties do actually write like that

#3: Cindy: "The Glitch"

A 2-minute-rap with music. Cindy will perform dressed up as a rapper.

Grandmaster Flash (*1958) riff (rhythm) as background music.

Feedback:

Barbara: Finds it suitable to the topic but thinks there have to be more verses. Did not understand the point Cindy is trying to make.

Michael: It's possible that it might be misunderstood as a parody. What exactly is your message or critique? What's your frustration you'd like to express? Right now it feels too much like a parody.

Barbara: "Don't call me Mitch" --> who is Mitch? --> Why don't you say "don't call me a Bitch"; rap is a really hard way of expressing poetry

#4: Andrea: "At the laundromat"
